

## ABOUT ASPEN

ASPEN Network Inc. (ASPEN) is a recently established non-profit organization that uniquely began under the Jefferson County Health Department. As of 2023 ASPEN programs include a comprehensive virtual resource directory that encompasses the Jefferson County, St. Louis and surrounding regions housing over 1,400 resources that are regularly validated and updated. ASPEN currently provides education, training, resources, and screening tools to 14 school districts, Jefferson College and 11 first responder agencies.

These innovative tools have been meticulously developed to raise awareness about available resources and provide essential information to those seeking mental health support in the community.





## EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MESSAGE

ASPEN Network Inc. began in 2018 as a vision to address access to care, rising mental health and substance use needs in our communities. Over 40 providers came together between 2018 and 2021 to identify concerns and form a bridge to solutions. After initial pilot phases in 2022 ASPEN began to receive interest from schools, first responders, health care and social service entities throughout the St. Louis Region and Missouri. This drove the decision to become an independent non-profit in 2023 and the expansion of programs.

As we move forward into 2024 ASPEN's focus will continue to strive towards meeting the growing mental health needs among youth and adult populations.

It has been an honor to work with our communities, staff, partners and Board of Directors.

#### Schools


ASPEN Network Inc. provides schools and families access to student related resources, including a student self-driven questionnaire and school counselor led screenings.

School staff such as, school counselors, school social workers or administrators can help students and families identify possible areas of concern and help connect the family to resources.

#### First Responders

First Responders and their families face unique challengers and often higher rates of mental health issues due to their line of work. ASPEN Network Inc. works with responders to help provide validated resources and unique mental health screening tools. The Resource Directory provides information about mental health professionals trained to work with responders. Additional education is provided on the ASPEN website and easily accessible.




## FIRST RESPONDERS




Total Responders With Completed Screenings: 78

Total Identified at Low/Moderate/High Risk for Suicide: <u>18</u>



In 2023 ASPEN worked with 6 first responder agencies and saw over 50% of staff utilize screening tools and resources, of this over 20% showed a possible risk of suicide. This deidentified data provided a springboard for ASPEN staff to work with department leaders and provide additional training and resources.




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
## SCHOOL AND YOUTH



## ASPEN Youth Data by Age

Utilization data showed that higher rates of 14 - 18 year old youth were completing selfquestionnaires and counselor led screenings





#### **ASPEN Youth Data by Gender**

Students utilizing ASPEN screening tools who showed high risk concerns noted a higher rate of female.

#### Did you know?

According to the 2023 Youth Risk Behavior Survey Nearly 3 in 5 teen girls (57%) said they felt "persistently sad or hopeless."

#### MENTAL HEALTH SUMMIT

July 17th, 2023 ASPEN and community partners hosted the 2nd annual Mental Health Summit at Festus High School. Over 100 school administrators, counselors, providers, first responders and partners attended to learn about how to address behavioral health needs. Missouri Children's Division Director Darrell Missey was the keynote speaker and Senator Elaine Gannon presented a special award.

#### **Presentations**

ASPEN Network Inc. staff and consultants provided presentations throughout the state of Missouri, including the Missouri Juvenile Justice Conference hosted in St. Louis.



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#### **Education and Expansion**

ASPEN staff provided education and inperson trainings to over 14 school districts and 11 first responder agencies. Social media education videos and content reached over 12,000 individuals.

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
